Many of you have been asking questions about the Xenith Helmet that is being shown at Westwood for purchase. It is an expensive item and many of you are interested, but have questions. Keith at Action Sporting Goods has answered some of the most frequently asked questions. Remember you can spend \$300 on a bat for baseball or \$200 on helmet for Lacrosse.

Is it required to purchase this helmet?

No, Round Rock ISD provides the players with an approved helmet

Can we get a discount if we purchase a certain amount?

Yes, if 12 players purchase the helmet, the price will drop in price from \$350.00 to \$292.50 for everyone purchasing the helmet.

Does my son get to keep the helmet?

No, once the player has purchased the helmet and used it in a game/practice it becomes the property of RRISD.

What happens to the helmet and how do I know that my son will get the one we purchased?

There is a specific serial number in each helmet. Your son's helmet will be turned in at the end of the season and will be tagged for him for any further practices or use. You will have the serial number, so you can make sure that your son gets his same helmet back. When the player graduates or leaves the football program the helmet becomes the property of Westwood/RRISD.

So what do we get out of spending all this money and not having anything in return?

The peace of mind knowing that your son is wearing one of the best helmets for protection. Please note that the one provided by the district meets all the safety requirements. RRISD just cannot spend \$300 per helmet per player. In addition, because it is considered a donation, you will be able to get a form from RRISD/Westwood Athletics for tax purposes showing your donation of a \$292.50 for the helmet.

Who is responsible to make sure the helmets are maintained?

Right now, it would be a Representative from Xenith and one from Action Sporting Goods, who would come in and check the helmets before each season to ensure that they are up to Xenith's standards and RRISD's.

Where do the helmets go during off-season?

They should stay at Westwood in the Equipment Room until the players need them.
